INTRODUCTION

It is four years since we released our first report on the performance of law firms and barristers in the UK High Courts. One of the responses was a 16,521% increase in our Twitter traffic and many lawyers commenting anonymously and angrily on LinkedIn and other public media. Now legal analytics is “the new black” and the furore that a US-based start-up business had the audacity to analyse the performance of lawyers and question whether their clients were receiving value has diminished to grumbling acceptance together with the need to pretend to offer similar services. Many general counsel now require performance data from their law firms. This goes beyond asking, “Was your lawyer responsive and courteous?” to understanding hard outcome and results data. General counsel are asking piercing questions of their lawyers, insurers are seeking data on their insured risks and law firms are playing catch up. A few law firms realise that winning new clients is simple when you can prove you are better than their existing lawyers. Displaced firms are reluctantly joining the performance bandwagon rather than risking falling further behind.

SCOPE OF COVERAGE

The UK High Courts have just under 4,000 cases per year. We analysed approximately 12,000 of them for our last report. The number two analytics company in the UK recently announced a 5,000-case database. The Premonition UK database has over 140,000 cases. This may sound impressive, but it represents far fewer cases than the amount that are filed every week in America. We have added Canada, the Netherlands, Australia, New Zealand, India and many more speciality courts on our way to becoming the World’s largest litigation database, bigger than LexisNexis™, Thomson Reuters™ and Bloomberg™ combined.

MORE DETAIL

It is surprising to learn that many of the law firms currently touting their prowess on their smart web sites about Bitcoin, autonomous vehicles and drone law have never tried a single case in any of these areas. Our 2014 Report contained just the highlights of the cases in the database: judges, lawyers, parties involved and, to many, the all-important result: who won. Premonition now automatically downloads, reads and keeps a copy of every legal document it lays its digital tentacles upon. With more than 1.2 million documents filed each day in America alone this is no small feat. Fortunately, the Premonition system can read 50,000 documents in less than a second. Asking the system questions like, “Which law firms and barristers have actually won cases involving self-driving cars? What were the settlement amounts involved and which Judges ruled for which side?” are now simple enquiries.

CASE TYPES

Courts elsewhere will apply dozens, sometimes over a hundred, highly detailed case types to a court case to help classify it. While there is some attempt at this in the UK, in areas like admiralty or patent law, for the most part this is ignored, and hundreds of cases are grouped together under highly unhelpful taxonomies like “Queens Bench”. Premonition has developed systems to read all cases and group similar ones together under standard case types. These are then mapped to general case types in other courts, enabling clients to map litigation to claims in their specialist areas. All part of a well thought out system.

WHAT DID WE FIND?

Things lie exposed in the public record that anyone with a first-class analytics platform can uncover. Our 2014 report showed that a law firm’s choice of barrister was 38% worse than random and General Counsel’s choice of Law Firms was 18% worse than random. The analysis of courts data still yields a few surprises. The 2018 Report shows that:

- In Civil Appeals, the barrister with the best win rate in the three-year report period went for 13 cases with a 75% win rate, while another barrister didn’t win a case in five appearances.
- In Civil Appeals, defendant straight wins are down this year, making it more important to examine the data.
- Plaintiffs win more than double the rate in America.
- The Barrister’s chambers section is broken down into 83 men (78%) and 23 women (22%), with 47 London chambers (84%) and 9 provincial chambers (16%).
- Our latest diversity and gender analysis tools found that the bar, as represented in the High Courts, is even less diverse than the, already poor Bar Standards Board figures.
- One lawyer managed 15 cases with 91% win rate in family division court, which is one of the best win rates we have seen in this court.
- Litigants in Persons are much better than might be thought. As a group, they out-perform the professionals.

WATCH FOR ARTICLES ON THESE LATER IN THE YEAR.

The legal landscape is shifting, and analytics is driving that change. With only a 3% correlation between higher fees and better performance, the profession is ready for Perception/Reality Arbitrage. The way law firms and barristers are instructed will never be the same again.

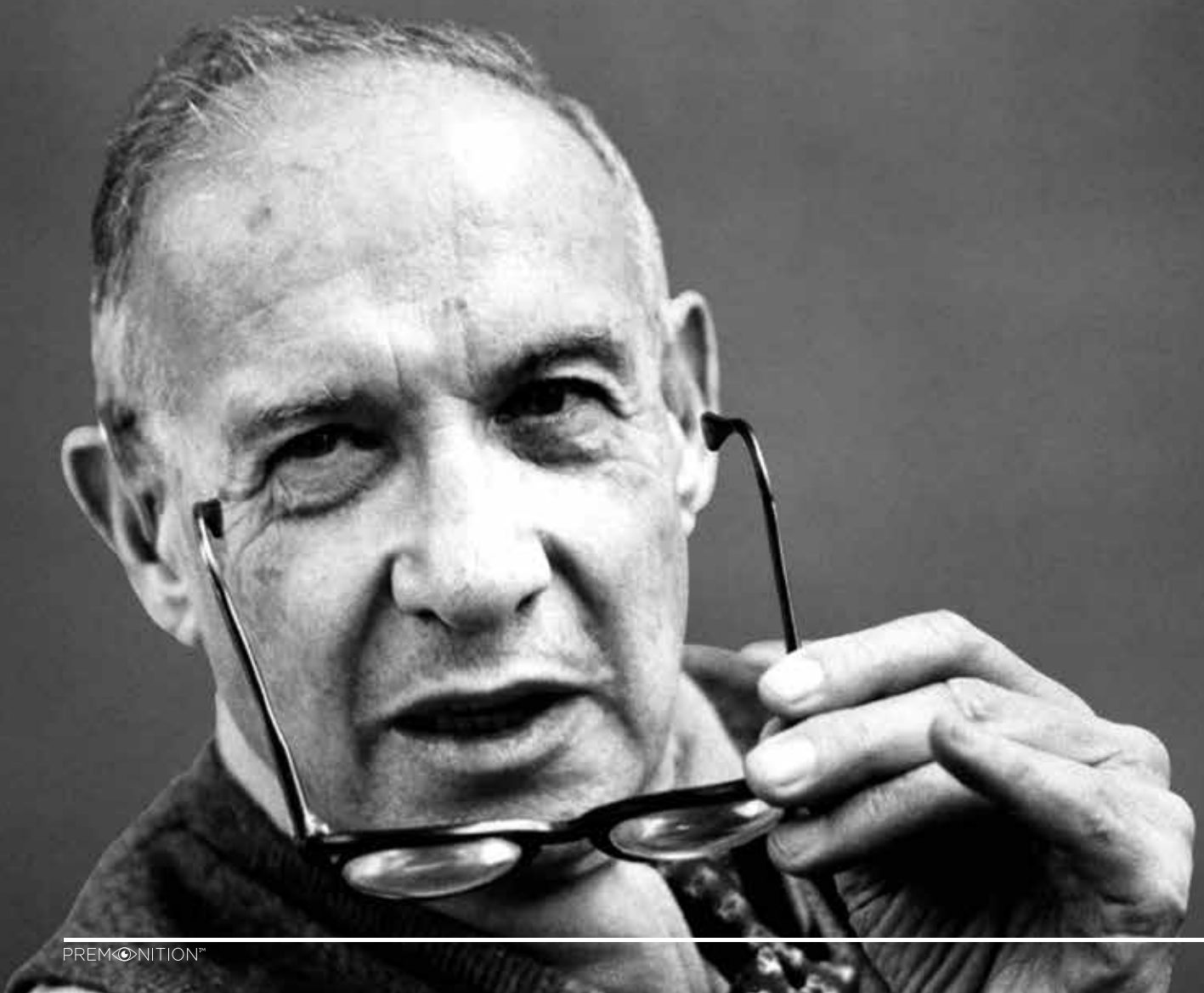

There are those who will dismiss the idea of measuring the performance of a law firm or a barrister who appears in the High Court and feel that this reduces the art and skill of case presentation, advocacy and the mastery of evidence to mere numbers.

Numbers, as we know, play a major role in shaping human societies. Very few national governments are entirely without means of tracking the behaviour and opinions of their citizens, and numbers such as social security numbers and the results of opinion polls are closely watched as an aid to social control and central planning, as we all been reminded in the news lately.

In science, the habit of either proving a general concept or of quantifying an observed phenomenon requires a sophisticated use of numbers. Making sense of the data available to astronomers, chemists and biologists among others would be impossible without a system of assigning values and weighing variables.

Economically, numbers are central to human activity. Without numbers, there would be no civilisation and, to manage any element of that, measurements are required. Any activity can be measured, that data analysed, and decisions taken using the results. The law and legal work is no exception and the availability of data and its analysis can only help improve choice and standards for both practitioners and their clients.

There will be those who argue that the legal processes in the High Court are too multidimensional to measure: that the weight of evidence will decide; that judges are not infallible; that some lawyers take on only the hardest cases and that some of the plaintiff or defendant protagonists are surprisingly unreliable on the day. Even so, it is unarguable that those who are in either side of the case want to win. What client goes to the High Court wanting to lose?

Indeed, the client, especially with the high costs of High Court litigation, is becoming wiser about by what means law firms and barristers are chosen to represent them. Those who finance commercial litigation risk a lot by making a bad choice of legal representatives.

There will also be those who will take issue with the concept of 'winning' or 'losing' a case and that, perhaps, reducing the quantum might be a very good thing for the client or that an unreported out of court settlement was reached or that there were other factors which mitigated the 'lost case'. These points are for the lawyers concerned to argue and explain when asked about their track record by those clients who have Premonition's data. Essentially, the traditional ways of choosing legal representation have changed with the increasing influence of AI, Big Data and other irresistible forces. Many articles have been written about such forces and show a new clear way of thinking.

The charts in this report are anonymised. It is not the objective of Premonition's work to declare any law firm or barrister 'good' or 'bad' at their jobs, but to highlight winning law firms and barristers with proven track records. Those who subscribe to our services will have access to the detail in the reports with all the information of the law firms, solicitors and barristers involved in each chosen case. No one, however, expects law firms and barristers to be instructed on the basis of this information alone. Those who have already subscribed to Premonition data have used it as a major part of their decision process; the performance data is a persuasive, quantitative and objective tool in an otherwise qualitative and subjective process.

This report will concentrate on the 11,067 UK High Court cases for the calendar years of 2016, 2017 and 2018. The charts contained show a scatter of data points representing performance (in terms of winning the case) against the number of times a law firm or barrister has appeared in the High Court. The last three years have been selected for illustrative purposes and, plainly, the more years selected for any court, law firm or barrister the more densely populated with data points the chart will be. Similarly, the identity information behind the data points will provide rich detail and information on those who appear in the High Court and their successes.

TOP TEN PERFORMERS BY COURT

INTRODUCTION

As a sample of the macro-level analysis Premonition software is capable of producing, this Appendix provides the top ten performing barristers and firms by win percentage in each of the UK's courts. Any lawyer or practice that does not appear on these lists either lacks the minimum number of appearances required to qualify or has simply not won a high enough percentage of their cases.

In the interest of protecting the privacy of the named lawyers, these top ten lists are presented in alphabetical order —referencing these rankings when selecting representation effectively gives readers a one in ten chance of making the best statistical choice. However, even within the rarefied air of the most successful barristers in the United Kingdom, there is usually a significant difference between first and tenth. For example 21 consecutive wins and a 91% win rate versus eight wins and a 83% win rate. Those who wish to receive the full statistics and narrow their search still further can purchase the complete report from Premonition.

The legal profession is already experiencing the disruptive impact of Premonitions comprehensive work and court reports. Increasingly general counsels are relying on hard statistics to support their reasoning, while successful practitioners now use Premonition's data analysis to market their services. By default, those barristers and firms who find themselves outside the top ten are already losing the opportunity to reach this analytics-aware clientele.

METHODOLOGY

SHORTLISTS

The central purpose of Premonition is to provide shortlists of capable, proven lawyers for selection by the client. It is not an absolute, it's indicative. Factors such as lawyer availability, price, personal chemistry, and other factors may all affect individual selection. A client may well feel that sixth out of twenty is a better fit than the first. Either way, we commonly find a considerable uplift in anticipated result.

DETERMINING WINS

What constitutes a win is an arguable point, and a common question. If you call both lawyers on a closed case, both will often claim to have 'won'. Every case is arguable. We consulted with several lawyers and judges asking them about the general winners and losers for various dispositions types (we have over 100 different types categorised within the solution). There was broad agreement that judgements went for plaintiffs, dismissals for defendants and settlements shouldn't be counted. All cases are arguable on an individual basis. Premonition is not a 'rocket science' system where we strive for 100% unarguable analysis of every case, the function is to spot trends and outliers, which it does extremely well as data is 'smoothed out' over many thousands of cases.

CASE DIFFICULTY

Every case differs in difficulty and complexity. Premonition does not assess the difficulty of a case. Lawyers often claim to "only take the toughest cases" when explaining low win rates. Occasionally this is true. The United Kingdom has a 'Cab Rank Rule' preventing barristers from cherry picking easy cases and the results are similar to the United States, so we don't feel cherry picking is much of a factor. Premonition is not designed to identify the 'surgeon' lawyers that only work the hardest cases. However, it does group cases with those of similar difficulty by using case type, sub-type and parties. Tax Court is notorious for its low win rates against the HMRC; however top performing lawyers still stand out, not by their wins, but because they lose less. Cases grouped by court type, Appeals Court being a more rigorous black letter law venue than small claims, and by judge, where certain cases, (e.g. complex business claims) are assigned to certain judges. Over time, case difficulty variations are also smoothed out over the large numbers of cases and lawyers.

MULTIPLE ATTORNEY CASES

Premonition picks the first listed lawyer for each side and ignores the others. The system is not perfect but brings the least overall inaccuracies. In courts where lawyers per party are not identified specifically, it uses an algorithm to predict which lawyer represents which party, then selects the first one for each side to be analysed. Co-counsel are not automatically analysed unless specifically requested by the client.

GENDER AND DIVERSITY

Premonition matches names to census data and calculates the likely gender and race based on first and last names. On an individual basis, this is highly unreliable. However, at scale, accuracy approaches that of the census itself.

OVERALL DATA ACCURACY

In less than 5% of cases, data entry in court records causes issues which can make it difficult to import every field of data. Premonition data cannot be more reliable than the public record.

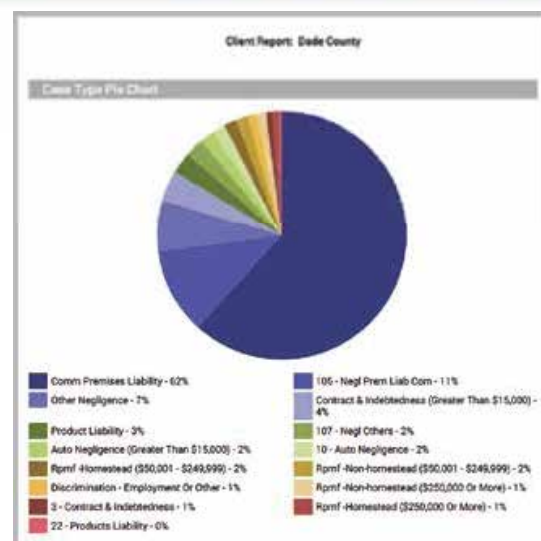

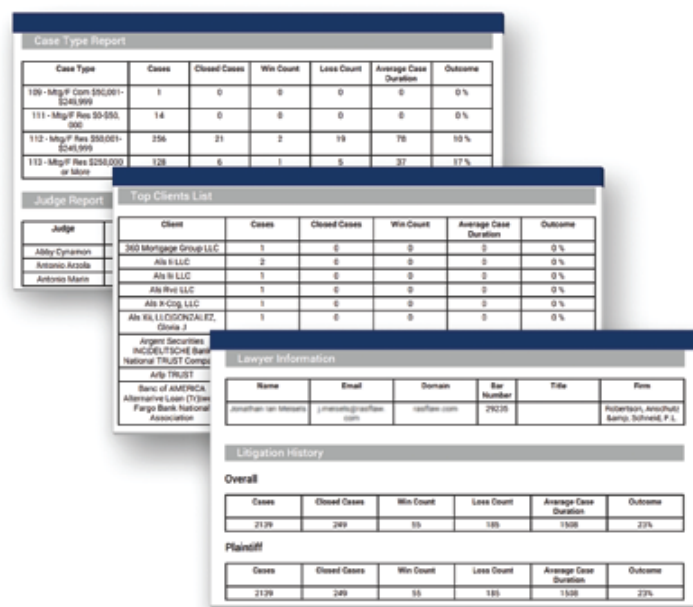
